



## "A CRITICAL LOOK AT THE KAVANAUGH HEARING"

Richard Salomon, Supervisory Special Agent (SSA), (retired), will be presenting the FBI's Background Investigative process along with the FBI's relationship with the Executive Branch vetting process. During his presentation, he will discuss the logic behind the FBI's former policy to "Neither Confirm or Deny the Existence of any Investigation." SSA Salomon will highlight the Clinton White House 900 FBI files and what this has to do with the Kavanaugh appointment hearing. He will further explain how these files have impacted the operations of the federal government.

SSA Salomon served as a Special agent from his appointment at the Denver Field Office of the FBI in 1984 through his retirement in 2010. His career encompassed 18 years in Minneapolis and Detroit as a field investigator, Special Weapons and Tactics Operator, and Assistant Team Leader. As an investigator, he covered many FBI jurisdictional programs, including White Collar Crime, Violent Crime and Major Offenders, Organized Crime and Drugs and Counter Intelligence.

He was awarded numerous commendations and awards for his investigative acumen and his record of success led to his promotion in 2002 to Supervisory Special Agent. He was transferred to FBI Headquarters as the Program Manager for the Health Care Fraud Unit in the Southeastern United States and Puerto Rico. After being awarded his second Masters Degree from the National War College, he was promoted in 2004 to lead the Military Liaison and Detainee Unit. In 2010 when SSA Richard Salomon retired, he was the Assistant Section Chief of the FBI's Terrorism Finance Operations Section where he was responsible for conducting investigative and intelligence operations for Domestic and Overseas targets.
